

# Bannerman Road Corridor Study

#### **NE Connector Corridor: Bannerman Road Project**


The Northeast Connector Corridor: Bannerman Road Project is a Blueprint 2020 Regional Mobility project encompassing the expansion of the Bannerman Road Corridor between Quail Common Drive and N. Meridian Road. The December 2020 issue outlined the project's purpose and first set of community engagement activities. The March 2021 issue provided information on current design work and additional community engagement activities in order to gather the community's input. This article will outline the project's current status and the goals of future community engagement.

#### **Current Status**

Updates to the 2012 Final Engineering Report (FER) are currently underway and involve defining existing corridor conditions and updating the report's recommendations. The updated recommendations will reflect results of the recently completed field survey and technical analyses, including intersection evaluation, environmental assessment, and stormwater planning. New development, both pending and existing, which has come about since 2012, will also be taken into account.

Once updates to the report are approved, staff can begin the design and permitting for the project consistent with the approved design. Roadway design should be complete by fall 2023 with construction anticipated to begin with the east side of segment 3 in 2024.

Updates regarding the status of the FER will be made available on the project's website, BannermanRoad.com.



#### Roadway Design

Many factors are considered when designing a roadway, and some are more specific to the local community in which the roadway will serve. In addition to increasing safety, reducing traffic congestion, and providing aesthetic landscape design elements, other design improvements for this project consider green infrastructure enhancements to improve the quality of run-off water, preserving the more rural character of the area, and providing pedestrian and bicyclist interconnectivity from internal neighborhoods to commercial areas and public spaces.

Pedestrian and bicycle pathways that will accompany other improvements along the Bannerman Road corridor are designed to connect to other planned pedestrian and bicycle networks to allow for regional travel and efficient connection between the Northeast and Northwest areas.

#### **Community Engagement**

Community Engagement events are designed to provide the community an opportunity to learn more about this multimodal transportation improvement project.


An additional round of community engagement is anticipated to be held during the design phase. The goal for community engagement will be to provide information on the roadway design. Input received during the design phase will be incorporated into the design of the Bannerman Road Corridor, where possible.




