


U.S. 19 Multi-Use Trail PD&E Study

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will hold a hybrid public meeting concerning the State Road 57 (U.S. 19) Multi-Use Trail Project Development & Environment (PD&E) Study in Jefferson County. This hybrid meeting is being held both virtually and inperson to provide interested persons an opportunity to express their views concerning the proposed improvements. Citizens are strongly encouraged to attend the virtual meeting online at www.nwflroads. com/virtualmeetings. Those who are unable to participate virtually may attend the meeting inperson. Pre-registration is required for the virtual format and encouraged for in-person attendees. See the information sheet in this handout for details.

The project would extend from Somerset Academy to approximately two miles north to the paved trail beginning at Martin Road. The proposed multi-use trail would be located primarily along U.S. 19 and may utilize portions of Nacoosa Road, South Old Drifton Road, and Aucilla Highway.

The meeting will be held as an open house format with representatives from the FDOT available to answer questions.

WHAT IS A PD&E STUDY?


A PD&E Study is the formal process that develops and compares alternatives to determine a preferred action that meets project needs, while minimizing impacts to the social, natural, and physical environments. Engaging the public by sharing and receiving information is a key component of this process and is required by the National Environmental Policy Act.

The meeting is being held to allow the public an opportunity to provide feedback on the improvements being proposed as part of this PD&E Study.

WHAT WILL THE MULTI-USE TRAIL LOOK LIKE?


FDOT has evaluated various alternatives for this project. These alternatives were presented to the public for review and comment during the Virtual Project Update on April 20, 2021, at www.nwflroads.com. Based on public input and the results of the environmental analysis conducted, FDOT is recommending that the Preferred Alternative be advanced to the design phase, and ultimately constructed. The proposed typical sections, which are visual representations of the basic configuration of the proposed roadway, are provided below.

SOUTH OLD DRIFTON ROAD




South Old Drifton Road has an existing 16-foot roadway that will be widened by two-feet to incorporate a one-way lane with a nine-foot shared-use path. The one-way lane and shared-use path safety enhancements include a bicycle lane separator.

AUCILLA HIGHWAY LOOKING EAST




Aucilla Highway looking east is an eight-foot paved shared-use path.





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
